I Love You

One of the most precious Psalms in Scripture is Psalm 139. It beautifully describes God's relationship to people. In this Psalm, David describes the extent of God's knowledge about individuals (omniscience) [1-6]. He then describes God's awesome omnipresence, which is a source of comfort to the righteous, and disturbance to the wicked [7-12]. He describes God's design, power and skill to create (omnipotence) [13-16]. He then describes God's affection for His creation [17-18]. After describing God's sense of justice [19-22], he then invites God to know him even more.

What God Knows

1. What does Psalm 139:1-6 tell us about how much God knows us?

2. How did the Psalmist feel about this? (Psalm 139:6)

Where God Is

- 3. What is the answer to the question found in Psalm 139:7?

- 4. Is God present in Hell according to Psalm 139:8?

- 5. Why is it comforting to those who know God, and disturbing to those who don't, to know that God is everywhere?

No matter where we are, or what we've done, God is able to guide us and direct us to higher ground (vs. 10).

God's Power

- 6. What does Psalm 139:13 add to the debate about abortion?

- 7. Why did the Psalmist feel to praise the Lord? What was he considering that caused him to praise the Lord? (Psalm 139:14)

David says that not only had God designed his physical features and appearance, but that He had also designed his life ahead of him (Psalm. 139:16).

God's Affection

- 8. How many times does God think about you according to Psalm 139:17-18?

This Psalm has laid the foundation of God's knowledge about people. He knows everything about us! Yet He still likes us. Sometimes we feel that we can't let people know who we really are because if they found out who we really were, they may not like us any more. But God knows our weaknesses, our deceitfulness, our selfishness, our insecurities, and all of our sins.
